


HSC PERFORMING ARTS SHOWCASE Semester One 2018

MS LISA FRISINA (PPHS Dance/Drama Teacher)

Did you know that when Ms Frisina is not at school, she is a member of Junkyard Beats and Mosman Musical Society.

Junkyard Beats is a professional drumming performance group that combines movement with recycled everyday objects, to present dynamic shows at events such as the Sydney Opera House Australia Day Concert, charity events, TEDx Conference, bar mitzvahs and schools. Junkyard Beats perform in a variety of locations all over Australia including recent locations such as Hamilton Island and Onslow WA. Routines include: drumming with fire on metal barrels, body percussion, kitchen utensils, boomwhackers, tap dancing and cajon drums. The group rehearses every Monday night from 5pm—10pm.

Mosman Musical Society In January 2018, Ms Lisa Frisina secured the role of Choreographer for Mosman Musical Societ Cabaret show, *Fly Me To The Moon* recently presented in March. In an 8 week timeframe, Ms Frisina had to choreograph 7 different routines while staying true to the 1940's jazz era. Preparing and rehearsing for the show was a large commitment with ensemble rehearsals held every Sunday for a period of 8 weeks. Five shows were presented to sold out audiences.
