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

We started off the day by being introduced to the theme of the workshop which was *Stand Up*. We entered the hall to find orange booklets containing several different activities placed on our seats. The first activity, *The Escape Room*, consisted of five challenging tasks requiring the groups to work together to complete them. This activity brought us closer and developed our communication skills.

Archibull Prize

The 2018 running of The Archibull Prize will see life-size fibreglass cows stampede into over 30 schools across New South Wales and Queensland, and Picnic Point High School will be part of the action. Our 7E class will be completing the Archibull Prize as part of the Gifted and Talented Program as a co-curricular Project Based Learning activity throughout Terms Two and Three.



Conceived by Art4Agriculture, the Archibull Prize is an annual program designed to give young people the skills to connect farmers and the community, and to co-create a bright future for Australian agriculture.

Armed with a life-sized fibreglass cow (or calf) and a paint kit, students will have the opportunity to research a specific agricultural industry and present their findings in art form.

Multiple cash prizes, up to \$1,000, are up for grabs as well as the coveted title of Grand Champion Archibull. Learn more on <u>The Archibull Prize</u> website.

7E will be studying the Wool Industry, and along with their creative cow, students will develop multi-media presentations and explore issues such as biodiversity, climate change, water use and renewable energy. Assisting them on their journey will be Samantha Wan – a Young Farming Champion who works as a Technical Officer and Auctioneer for Elders Wool, based at the National Wool Selling Centre, Melbourne.

The theme for the 2018 Archibull Prize is: Feeding, Clothing and Powering a Hungry Nation is a Shared Responsibility. Archies (the fibre-glass cows) must be completed by September 20 and the Awards Ceremony will be held in Sydney on November 20.
