Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$7.9 billion over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 215 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Project overview

The proposed works at Picnic Point High School involve the construction of new learning facilities, and demolition and upgrade of some existing buildings. This work will result in the following new or upgraded facilities at the school:

- four new general learning spaces
- new Technical Applied Science (TAS) workshops
- new Technical Applied Science (TAS) learning spaces
- new Visual Arts workshop
- new Visual Arts learning spaces
- new Music learning spaces
- new computer learning space
- upgraded and expanded Administration and Staff facilities
- landscaping and external improvements.

The upgrade works fall under a classification of works that do not require a development application, called a Complying Development Certificate (CDC). CDC plans and works are assessed by an accredited certifier rather than a local council.
